

Manatee District To Demonstrate Expansion of Free Wi-Fi Access Through School Buses and Community Partners Tomorrow

Using School Buses as roaming Wi-Fi hotspots, the School District of Manatee County is expanding the reach of free Wi-Fi access with the help of local churches, community centers and other community partners. The partnerships are designed to provide internet access to students who need it now that all courses are offered online due to campus closures related to COVID-19.
