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2014-15 Secondary Career and Technical Education Database Handbook

The Secondary Career and Technical Education Database Handbook (CTE) is for use by the school districts, and offers guidance on the reporting of career and technical education student data during Survey 5. It includes Secondary Career and Technical Education data elements, associated notes, reporting formats, edits, timelines, and supporting appendices.

What is WDIS?

WDIS [Workforce Development Information System] is the Workforce Development reporting system and uses seven reporting formats. Each format contains specific data elements required for gathering student and teacher data.

Secondary career and technical education students are reported in the K-12 reporting system. However, Secondary students are also reported in WDIS when they are co-enrolled in an adult general education program or when dually enrolled in a postsecondary career and technical education program.

What are the Requirements?

All public school districts are required to submit all Secondary Career and Technical Education enrollment data via the DOE Student Information Data Base.

Section 229.555(2), Florida Statues, requires the development and implementation of a comprehensive management information system linking all levels of the state education system.

Rule 6A-1.0014, Florida Administrative Code, details all automated student and staff information requirements.

Section 239.209, Florida Statues, addresses specific requirements regarding the career and technical education management information system.

This requirement applies even if the student has received a special diploma, a certificate of completion, or a special certificate of completion or a GED. Additionally, districts may choose to continue to offer FAPE through the school year in which students turn 22.

However, records on the transmission have the previous School Year coded. All updates, adds or deletes with this inconsistency would be rejected.

DISTRICT RESPONSIBILITY

6. District Number, Current Instruction/Service must be numeric in the range 01-69 or 71-75 and must be correct for the district submitting the data. -record rejected-
