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# 2015-16 Workforce Development Information System (WDIS) Database Handbook

The District WDIS Database Handbook is for use by the school districts, and offers guidance on the reporting of adult general education and postsecondary career and technical education student data in WDIS.

## What is WDIS?

WDIS is the Workforce Development reporting system and uses seven reporting formats. Each format contains specific data elements required for gathering student and teacher data.

Secondary career and technical education students are reported in the K-12 reporting system. However, secondary students are also reported in WDIS when they are co-enrolled in an adult general education program or dual-enrolled in a postsecondary career and technical education program.

## **WDIS System Requirements**

All public school districts are required to submit all postsecondary career and technical education and adult general education enrollment data via the Department of Education Student Information Data Base.

1008.41, Florida Statutes, requires the development and implementation of a comprehensive management information system linking all levels of the state education system.

Rule 6A-1.0014, Florida Administrative Code, details all automated student and staff information requirements.

1008.41, Florida Statutes, addresses specific requirements regarding the career and technical education management information system.

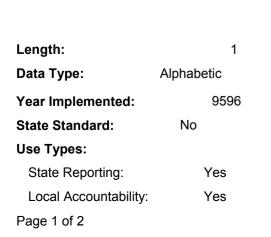

Secondary Career and Technical Education (CTE) data are reported in Survey 5.

Prior to the due date, the district should enter the necessary data in the local automated information system, prepare the necessary automated reporting formats from the local system, edit the data locally, and correct all edit errors. The reporting formats should be transmitted to the state on or before the due date.

The Department of Education will edit the data when they are received. Records that do not pass the reject rule edits are immediately rejected and not loaded to the database. When these edits are applied to an initial submission to NWRDC, any data set with twenty percent or more of its records in error will be rejected in its entirety. If less than twenty percent of the records in the data set do not pass the reject rule edits, the error-free records are loaded to the database and only the records in error are rejected. The twenty percent rule does not apply to data sets submitted for batch update. These edit programs are available for the districts to modify and run prior to submitting data for a survey.

Error reports will be made available to the district via the Northwest Regional Data Center (NWRDC). The district should correct the records and resubmit the data. When all reject errors have been corrected, the district should request the Validation and Exception reports, using the online system at NWRDC. If there are validation errors, the district should correct them and re-submit the data.

After each state processing window is closed, records will then be processed by CCTCMIS, which will use the data in producing files and reports, including those that are used in placement, follow-up, and workforce development funding. Other agencies and organizations also will use these records.

**NOTE**: Districts may update WDIS data for a closed survey during the next open survey *of the same reporting year*. The district must contact Bruce Harrington in writing (bruce.harrington@fldoe.org) in order to update.
