

EMERGENCY ORDER EXTENDING EMERGENCY ORDER
TO ACCOMMODATE VICTIMS OF HURRICANE IRMA

Florida continues to recover from the devastating effects of Hurricane Irma. Evacuees from affected areas continue to attempt to resume their normal lives. Those displaced people continue to need the accommodations afforded in the emergency orders that I entered following the hurricane. Governor Scott signed Executive Order 17-235 on September 4, 2017, that was extended by Executive Order 17-287 on November 2, 2017. Those executive orders authorize state agencies to extend emergency orders in thirty-day increments.

Therefore, in accordance with Executive Order 17-235 and Executive Order 17-287, I extend the Emergency Order Relating to the Impact of Hurricane Irma signed on October 10, 2017 for an additional 30 days.
