## Bay District Schools' Record of Success

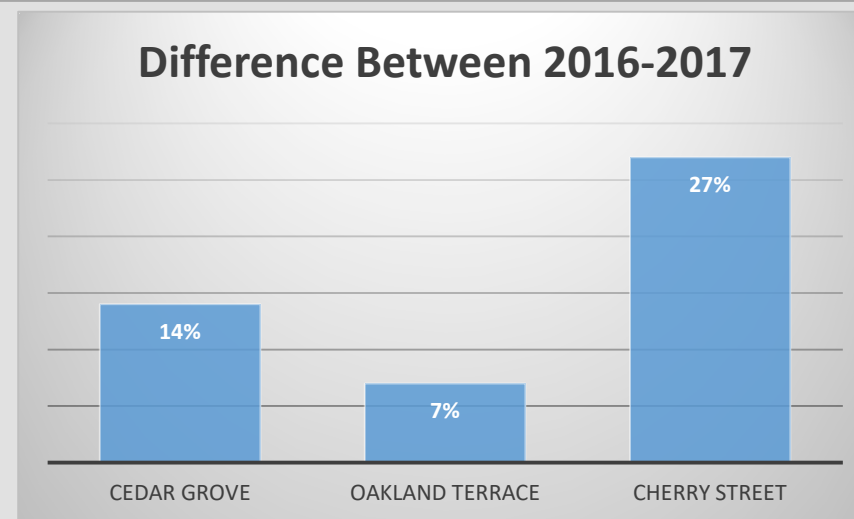
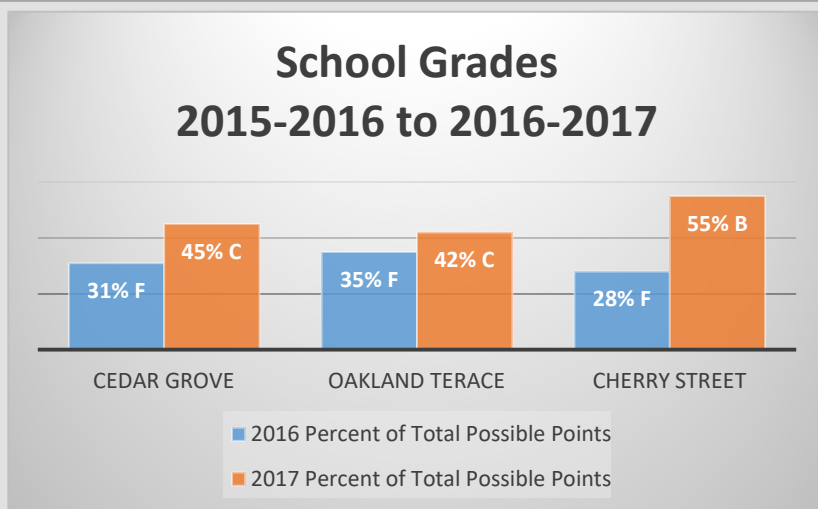
**96%** (29 out of 30) Bay District non-charter schools **increased or maintained** school grades from 2016 to 2017

Bay District Schools **decreased** the number of schools receiving a D or F  
 2015-2016 - 9 schools  
 2016-2017 - 3 schools\*  
*[\*The New Teacher Project (TNTP) as External Partner]*

Bay District Schools **decreased** the number of schools in Differentiated Accountability

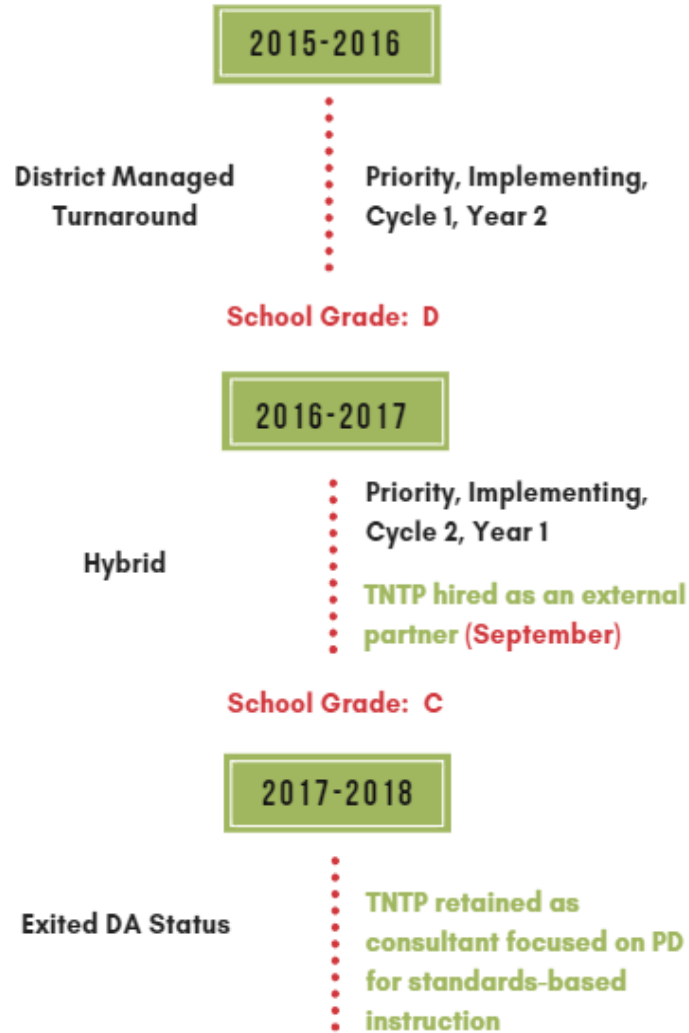
- 2015-2016 - 11 schools
- 2016-2017 - 5 schools
- 2017-2018 - 3 schools

Using Bay District Schools' Hybrid Model, two schools (Cedar Grove and Oakland Terrace) designated as Turnaround moved to Cs in 2016-2017. Additionally, Cherry Street, who was categorized in Differentiated Accountability as "planning" based on the school grade of F, attained a school grade of B in 2016-2017.

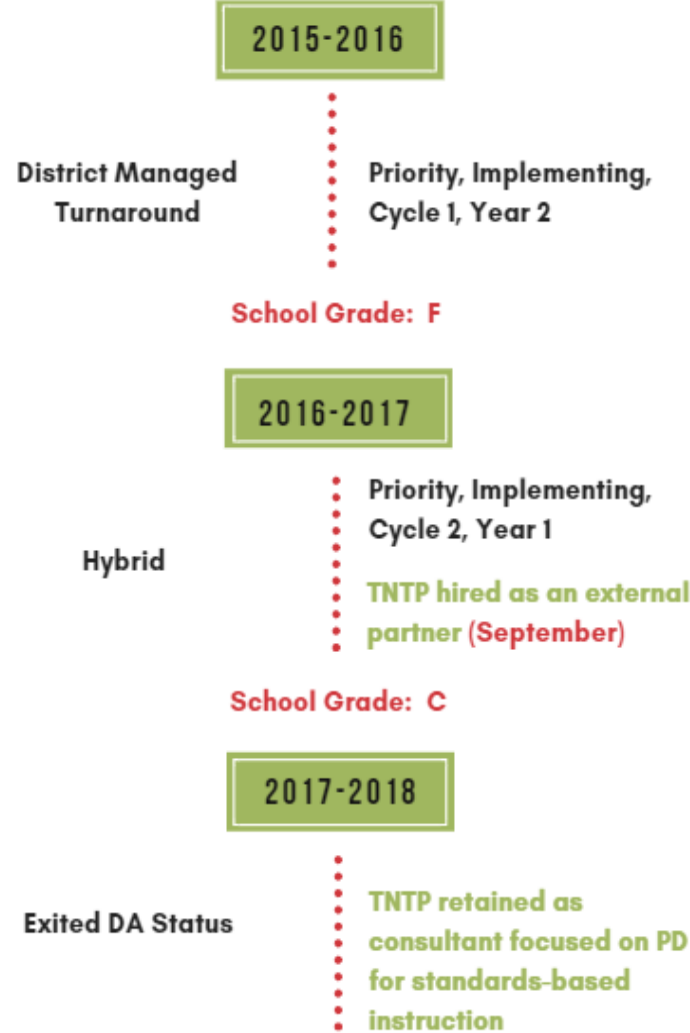


**Bay District Schools has the capacity to increase school grades.  
 An additional year for Oscar Patterson will give us the time necessary to increase the school to a C or better.<sup>2</sup>**

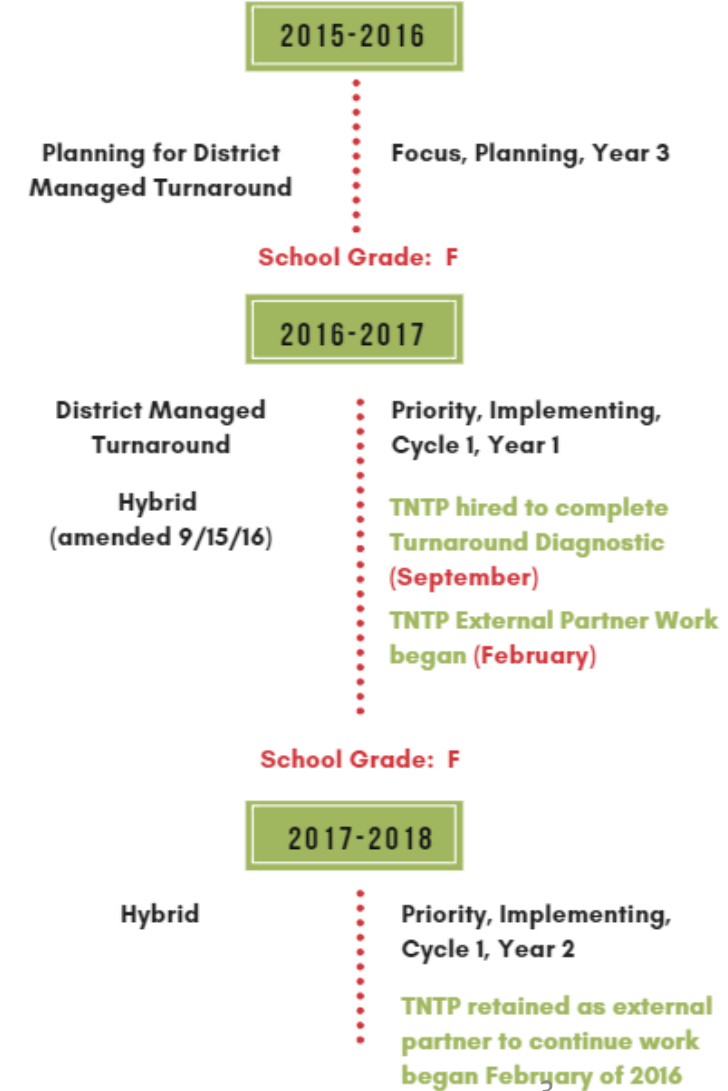

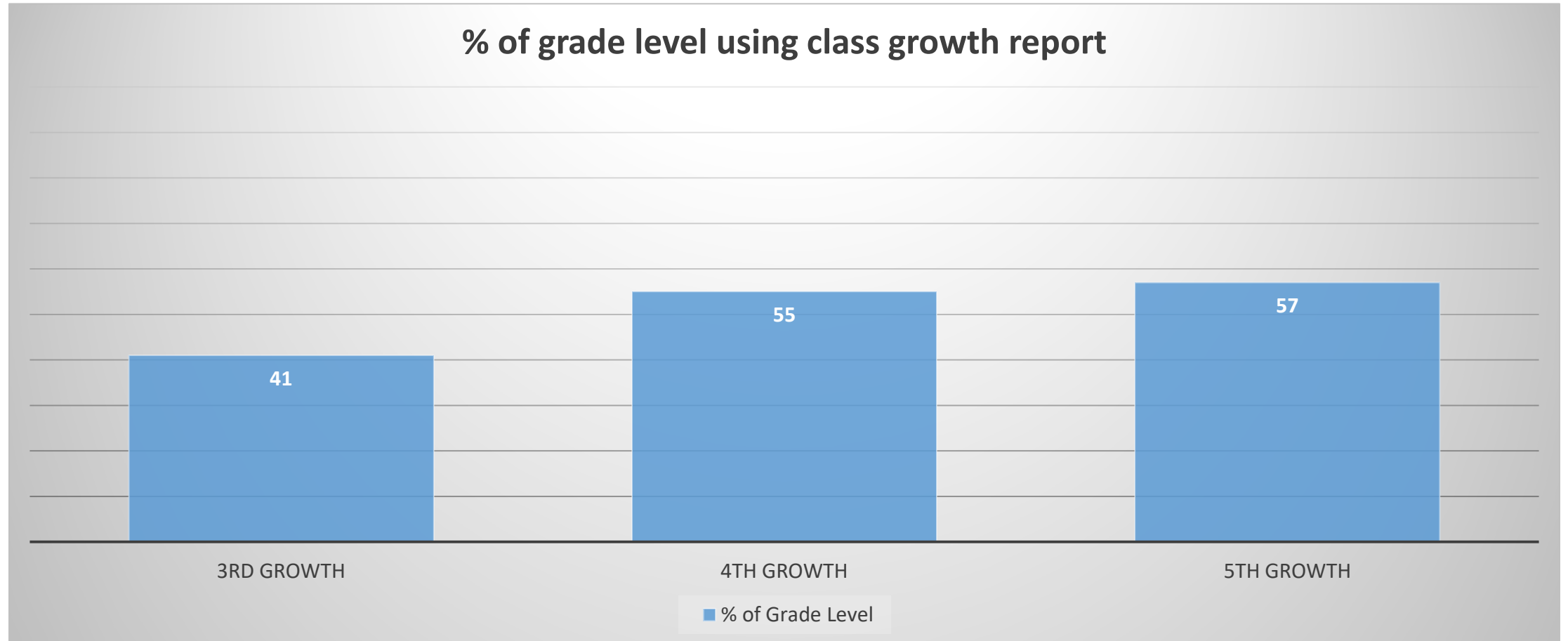

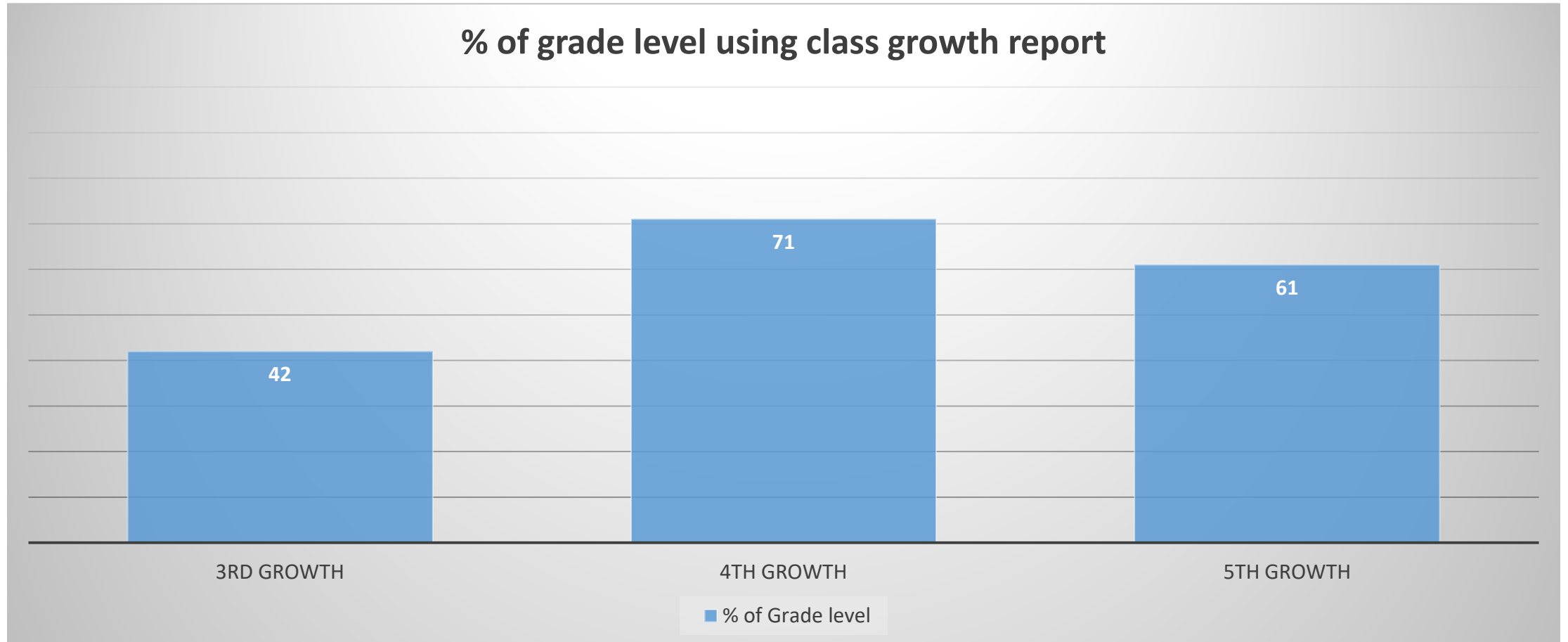
