(C) Public and Private Postsecondary Institution Agreements with Private Schools

Each postsecondary institution eligible to participate in the dual enrollment program pursuant to s. 1011.62(1)(i) must enter into a private school articulation agreement with each eligible private school in its geographic service area seeking to offer dual enrollment courses to its students, including, but not limited to, students with disabilities.

By August 1 of each year, the eligible postsecondary institution shall complete and submit the private school articulation agreement to the Department of Education.

1. A delineation of courses and programs available to the private school student. The postsecondary institution may add, revise, or delete courses and programs at any time.

A. Program Provisions

Students may enroll in courses applicable to an Associate of Arts (AA) degree, Associate in Science (AS) degree, and Certificate programs. A full listing of degree and certificate programs are available at: <http://go.spcollege.edu/degrees/>

1. Delineation of Course Offerings

Current law allows for any course in the Statewide Course Numbering System, with the exception of remedial courses and physical education skills courses, to be offered as Dual Enrollment. 2. The initial and continued eligibility requirements for private school student participation, not to exceed those required of other dual enrollment students.

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2. Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible for participation in the Dual Enrollment Program, a student must be in grades 6-12, demonstrate prior academic achievement by attaining at least a 3.0 unweighted high school grade point average or at least a cumulative 3.0 unweighted grade point average in a particular field of study, meet common placement test requirements, and otherwise demonstrate that he/she is prepared for the dual enrollment experience. Student qualifications for enrollment in career certificate dual enrollment courses must include a 2.0 unweighted grade point average. Students who fall below these eligibility standards may be considered for continued dual enrollment with approval of on an individual student basis.

3. The student's responsibilities for providing his or her own instructional materials and transportation.

5. Fees and Instructional Materials

All Dual Enrollment students will be exempt from payments of registration, tuition and lab fees. Students are responsible for instructional materials which include textbooks, workbooks, kits, equipment, and tools. Students are responsible for any additional programs fees or cost of instruction.

2. Transportation

When applicable, parents or legal guardians will arrange and be liable for all transportation to and from St. Petersburg College campuses.

4. A provision clarifying that the private school will award appropriate credit toward high school completion for the postsecondary course under the dual enrollment program.

In addition to the responsibilities set forth above, the private school shall:

(5) assure that the appropriate high school credit will be awarded to students participating in the Program,

5. A provision expressing that costs associated with tuition and fees, including registration, and laboratory fees, will not be passed along to the student.

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All Dual Enrollment students will be exempt from payments of registration, tuition and lab fees. Students are responsible for instructional materials which include textbooks, workbooks, kits, equipment, and tools. Students are responsible for any additional programs fees or cost of instruction.

6. A provision stating whether the private school will compensate the postsecondary institution for the standard tuition rate per credit hour for each dual enrollment course taken by its students

N/A Per recent legislative changes, this provision has been removed from our private school agreements.

7. For students with disabilities, a postsecondary institution eligible to participate in dual enrollment pursuant to s. 1011.62(1)(i) shall include in its dual enrollment articulation agreement, services and resources that are available to students with disabilities who register in a dual enrollment course at the eligible institution.
