



Florida College System's Response to Governor's \$10,000 Degree Challenge

In 2012, Governor Rick Scott challenged the Florida College System (FCS) to work to develop baccalaureate degrees costing students no more than \$10,000.

Our colleges heard the governor's call and all 24 colleges approved to offer baccalaureate degrees signed on to the challenge. As of fall 2014, 21 colleges reported implementing \$10,000 baccalaureate degrees.
