Deadline for applications for the 2017-2018 school term will be April 7, 2017. Completed applications will be accepted no later than 4:45 P.M. on Friday, April 7, 2017 and must be delivered by the applicant.

Applications must be received and returned personally by the applicant. Applications are not to be mailed into this office.

Applications for entry into this program are accepted without regard to race, religion, color, sex or national origin.

All applicants must:

- 1. Be 18 years of age or older by time of interview;
- 2. Furnish a VALID driver's license;
- 3. Furnish a copy of birth certificate. If your last name is not the same of that which is on your birth certificate, you will have to provide proof of your name change;

- 4. Be a high school graduate by June 9, 2017. Furnish a high school diploma AND an *official* transcript of high school grades. If you have a G.E.D., furnish an official G.E.D. certificate AND official G.E.D. test scores. If still a high school student, please submit a letter from the school on letterhead stating that you are on track to graduate, and provide graduation date and your official transcripts before application deadline you will be required to turn in your diploma and completed official transcripts immediately following graduation.
- 5. If a veteran, please submit a copy of discharge form DD214.
- 6. Furnish an *official* Driver History Record from the Division of Drivers Licenses in Tallahassee covering seven years. (Form provided by this office Cost \$10 to DOL.);
- 7. Be physically able to perform all tasks related to the plumbing and pipefitting industry and pass a physical examination by a medical doctor if accepted into the program;
- 8. Submit to a substance abuse test as required by the Committee;
- 9. Be of good moral character;
- 10. Satisfy the Joint Apprenticeship Trustees that you have the ability and desire to master the trade;
- 11. Agree to participate in remedial instruction required by the Joint Apprenticeship Trustees; and
- 12. Abide by the Standards adopted by the Joint Apprenticeship Trustees.

In addition to the above stated minimums, a good background in mathematics, science, drawing, shop or industrial arts is desirable.

Please note that applications are for the apprentice school year starting September 2017. No apprentices will be selected or put to work from total number of applicants until all applicants are interviewed by the Trustees.
