- The Literacy and Science Education category will focus on the development of literacy skills in the context of science teaching and learning. Projects will be funded that highlight techniques and practices that embed literary strategies in inquiry-based science instruction and support improved science achievement.

Project directors for recipients of large grant awards will be flown to Dallas to attend the awards banquet held during the NSTA convention.
