Program Reviews

Programs are reviewed on a 3-year cycle by a committee of at least 50% industry members per Florida Statute.



2015-2016 school year

Air-Conditioning, Refrigeration and Heating Technology

- Eight districts and two colleges throughout the state nominated instructors.
- Instructors reviewed the curriculum framework with their program advisory committees and sent their comments.
- A GoToMeeting was held to discuss and consolidate the comments.
