Wednesday/Thursday January 18th/19th Teachers will have each child make a book cover of their favorite book and put it together as a classroom quilt to display in the hallway before Friday the 20 th for Leadership day. Each teacher will fill out a questionnaire with a picture of themselves and their favorite book. This questionnaire will be added to the middle of the class quilt. (ex. hole punch, staple pieces together)	
Ongoing School Events	Ongoing school events include a member of administration or leadership team sharing their favorite book on the morning news (Steenken on day one with Montez, Work day 2, Dos Santos day 3). Teachers will participate in a reading challenge where books read by students will be tallied. After students read a book, they will tally on a chart that will be displayed in a central school location for all to see.
Monday, January 23	Mrs. Steenken will be promoting her favorite book on the morning news. Mrs. Crowley, and the Superheroes "Motyl & Clevenger" will help our school kick off our "Literacy Changes Our World!" ongoing reading promotion. The state theme is Literacy Changes Our World! We will participate in this event by implementing DEAR (drop everything and read). At 8:45, an announcement will be made to drop everything and read. (Idea: get small flash lights or have students bring them in to "Shine the Light on Reading" during DEAR time. Everyone is expected to read for 20 minutes including all teachers and staff. The total minutes will be tabulated and turned into the district. Teachers will be given a section of a bar graph to fill in their class totals daily; each teacher will keep track of their amount.
Tuesday, January 24	Students should be encouraged to be reading nightly. Be sure to add these to the reading log for the Superintendent's Challenge. Teachers will take students on a gallery walk of the class quilts at their convenience.
Wednesday, January 25	Continue reading and adding to the classroom totals. Guest classroom readers will read in the classrooms of those teachers who wish to have a guest reader.
Thursday, January 26	Hats off to Reading! Student will wear their favorite hats to school. Continue reading to add to the classroom totals! Teachers ONLY can wear PJs to school to promote tonight's event. Author Rhonda Friend, will be in enrichments classes for K-3. All classes during their enrichment time will go to the media center. 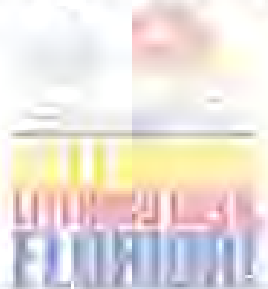

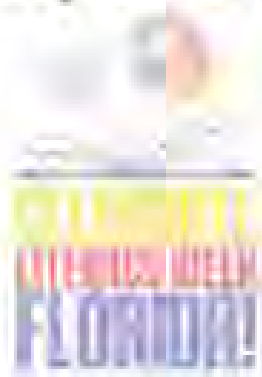
