<p>Monday, January 23rd</p>	<p>“Million Minute Marathon” throughout Collier County Public Elementary Schools</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Student will have the opportunity to hear the reading of the book <u>How Much is a Million?</u> • Million Minute Marathon- Sometime during the school day, teachers will allow their students to take an extra 15-20 minutes to read a book of their choosing. • Collier will calculate the number of minutes read by the whole District....hopefully meeting out GOAL of <p>Annual Family Literacy events will be hosted in most elementary schools during Celebrate Literacy Week, Florida! <p>Tuesday, January 24th</p>	<p>Corkscrew Elementary School: Tweet a picture of your favorite book – “Tweet Tuesday”</p> <p>Everglades City School: Class Favorite Book Day- Classes PK-12 will choose a favorite book and all dress-up as characters from that book. There will be a parade to see everyone’s costumes. High School Drama students will work with students to read their favorite books with dramatic flair.</p> <p>Lely Elementary School: QUICK WRITES- Students have a paper snowball toss, only to find a 3-minute quick write topic hiding inside each snowball.</p> <p>Naples Park Elementary School: Figurative Language Graffiti Wall (whole week)-Primary (nouns, verbs, adjectives)-Intermediate (metaphors, similes, idioms)</p> <p>Osceola Elementary School: A Young Author from each grade level will read their own authentic writing and be recorded. These performances will be uploaded to the OES Facebook account with the Principal, Dr. Castellani explaining the importance of reading and writing in the lives of children.</p> <p>Poinciana Elementary School: <i>Treasure Island Book Fair</i> starts and goes through January 27th!</p>
<p>Wednesday, January 25th</p>	<p>Big Cypress Elementary School: Vocabulary Parade: Students will create posters, hats and costumes to represent vocabulary words.</p> <p>Golden Gate Elementary School: <i>Writing Rocks Wear Some Funky Socks.</i> Young authors share a piece of writing in the media center. Grade levels would be paired with another class to share any published piece completed this year. Reading coaches will create the schedule for sharing a piece.</p> <p>Laurel Oak Elementary School: The Barbara Bush Foundation for Family Literacy student essay contest entries will be displayed in the Media Center and Cafeteria.</p> <p>Lake Trafford Elementary School: Chill out with a good book- Students will wear mittens, scarves, etc. and read a book (possibly during centers)</p> <p>Mike Davis Elementary School: “AuthorsRUS” Parents are invited to come work with their students during the Writing Wednesday school wide activity. Students will work to show their writing skills during the Young Author’s Event by picking from choices of a main character and a setting and putting the puzzle pieces together to make a story.</p> <p>Palmetto Elementary School: <i>Reader’s Café-</i> Classes will sign up for a time to come to the <i>Reader’s Café.</i> They will look at a menu and select a genre. They will get to read a book from that genre while eating a snack.</p> <p>Pelican Marsh Elementary School: Guest Author Visit: Rasheda Ali, Muhammad Ali’s daughter</p> <p>Tommie Barfield Elementary School: <i>Book Hat Day-</i> Decorate your hat to represent a favorite book. Uniform must be worn</p> <p>Veterans Memorial Elementary School: Book and Beach towels in the court yard</p>

<p>Thursday, January 26th</p>	<p><u>Estates Elementary School:</u> <i>Wear Your Words:</i> Each student picks a vocabulary word and dress themselves up with that word. The class with the most students dressed up will win extra recess.</p> <p><u>Eden Park Elementary School:</u> Grade 3 "Young Authors" sharing a writing piece on the Morning News (one per class or 3 per team). The Principal, Mrs. Salazar will be EPE's in house guest reader.</p> <p><u>Highlands Elementary School:</u> Vocabulary Super Bowl (Kahoot) Grades 4 and 5 only (grades 4 and 5 select teams and by today, a final will be set up between classes. Teachers should begin compiling previously taught vocabulary words to give to Literacy Team for the Kahoot Game.</p> <p><u>Lake Park Elementary School:</u> "Bring a Book, Take a Book" Book Swap</p> <p><u>Sabal Palm Elementary School:</u> <i>Book Balance Challenge</i></p> <p><u>Village Oaks Elementary School:</u> School wide – <i>Author's Tea</i> – Each grade level will have a designated time where students will bring one published piece to share with other students in their grade level. Students from different classes will sit together and share their writing. Parents will be invited, and Cookies and lemonade will be served.</p>
<p>Friday, January 27th</p>	<p><u>Calusa Park Elementary School:</u> "Stars on the Sidewalk"-End the week with buddy classes and/or individual classes enjoying buddy reading outside on sidewalks, picnic tables.</p> <p><u>Golden Terrace Elementary School:</u> K-2 Author Presentations</p> <p><u>Manatee Elementary School:</u> Vocabulary Parade</p> <p><u>Pinecrest Elementary School:</u> <i>Poetry Pop-In</i> - Staff are encouraged to 'pop' into a classroom to read a special poem.</p> <p><u>Parkside Elementary School:</u> <i>Musical Books</i> Each classroom will play musical books to expose students to a variety of books in a short time; sit chairs in a circle with a book on each; play music; when the music stops students sit down and read; after several rounds students choose a book to read.</p> <p><u>Sea Gate Elementary School:</u> Come Dressed as your favorite book character.</p> <p><u>Shadowlawn Elementary School:</u> <i>Career Book Share-Out</i> Allow students to share their Career Books with their peers! This will be organized with another class in the grade level or another grade level. You decide and coordinate!</p> <p><u>Vineyards Elementary School:</u> <i>Vocabulary Hat Parade</i> – Students will create a hat to reflect the meaning of an assigned vocabulary word. Teams will select a theme for their grade level. Using materials found in nature or at home, students will design a hat to display the meaning of the word. Students will parade throughout their grade level rooms to share their new vocabulary.</p>
