

<b>Ongoing District/School Events</b>	Ongoing school events include a member of administration or leadership team sharing their favorite book on the morning news. Teachers will participate in a reading challenge where books read by students will be tallied. After students read a book, they will tally on a chart that will be displayed in a central school location for all to see.
<b>Monday, January 26</b>	Mrs. Gelb will be promoting her favorite book on the morning news. Our school will kick off our "Reading Accelerates Success!" ongoing reading promotion. Teachers will be given a section of a bar graph to fill in their class totals daily; each teacher will keep track of their amount. The state theme is Reading Accelerates Success! Teachers will also be turning in a picture of the book along with a completed short questionnaire about their favorite book. These will be collected and organized to create grade level quilts that will be hung in the cafeteria. Each grade level committee member will be responsible for collecting the picture and questionnaires (these will be given the first day we come back in January).
<b>Wednesday, January 28</b>	Continue reading and adding to the classroom totals. Grade level quilts will be hung in the cafeteria.
<b>Thursday, January 29</b>	Hats off to Reading! Student will wear their favorite hats to school. Continue reading to add to the classroom totals!
