	 Monday–Friday students will read a daily quote related to "Literacy Changes our World" theme.
Tuesday, January 24 th	Favorite 5 Door Decorating.
	 English Language Arts, ESOL and Reading teachers ask students to select and vote on the "Favorite 5" books they have read.
	 Classes display their list and use these titles as their theme to decorate their classroom door.

Wednesday, January 25 th	DEAR (Drop Everything and Read):
	 Wednesday-Friday – Teachers dedicate 15 minutes during ELA, ESOL and Reading class for student-selected independent reading.
	• Students and teachers should read a book, magazine or other text of their choice without interruption in celebration of the joy of reading.
Thursday, January 26 th	Selfie Poems
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	• Submit Selfie poems to the Media Specialist or school administration.
	 School Administrators chose winning works and display them during morning announcement.
	• Schools tweet their winners to <i>MDCPSReading#SelfiePoems</i> .
Friday, January 27 th	Readers are College Bound:
	 Students wear a favorite college shirt or jerseys and take a picture in front of the <i>Favorite 5 Decorated Door</i> or <i>Selfie Poem</i> bulletin board.

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Parental/Community Involvement	 Literacy Shaping Our Lives: Ask students to interview family or community members about a favorite read. Ask them how literacy is significant in their everyday life. Share the conversations in class. Book in Hand: Students bring a new or slightly used book to school. The school will donate the books collected to a charitable institute such as a hospital or homeless shelter. Book Swap: Ask students to donate gently used chapter books and receive a ticket to choose another book on Friday.
