<p>Monday, January 23</p>	<p>Kick Off Celebrate Literacy Week! “Literacy Changes Our World!”</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. D.E.A.R. (Drop Everything and Read) Students will stop and read for 20 minutes each day after breakfast. Record the number of minutes read each day and number of students. Submit count to Mrs. Moffses at the end of the week for Million Minute Marathon. 2. ELA teachers will have students begin writing a piece in response to one of the 17 books to inspire kids to change the world. Teachers will pick the top writing piece and students will be rewarded.

<p>Tuesday, January 24</p>	<p>“Hunt Down a Good Book” 1. Students are encouraged to wear camo clothing.</p> <p>“Readers are Leaders” 2. Community members will visit classrooms and share books with students. 3. Students will design a book jacket of their favorite book and submit to be judged. One winner per grade level will be chosen and will receive a prize. Winning book jackets will be displayed.</p>
<p>Wednesday, January 25</p>	<p>“Hats Off to Books” 1. Students are encouraged to wear hats. 2. Students guess the number of books in the library. 3. Pre-K will read <i>I Don’t want to be a Frog</i>.</p>
<p>Thursday, January 26</p>	<p>“Score with Books” 1. Students are encouraged to wear their favorite team gear. 2. Students will partner with Reading Buddies of another grade levels to share a story.</p>
<p>Friday, January 27</p>	<p>“Super Readers” 1. Students are encouraged to dress up like their favorite super hero. 2. Winners of guess the number of books in the library and book jacket contest will be announced. 3. Winners of the writing activity will be awarded.</p>
