West Hernando	<p>Monday</p> <p> The circumference of the equator is 24,901 miles. Every day each Critical Thinking class will record how much time each student read the day before and calculate the cumulative number of seconds read. At the end of each day we will announce the total seconds read and determine how many times we traveled around the equator (one second = one mile) by the end of the week</p>

 Literacy Passport Book – Students will create a Literacy Passport in Critical Thinking and will get stamps during the second semester for books read from different countries. Books will be discussed during Lunch Box Literacy meetings throughout the semester

 Some students will visit PGES and read a theme-related book selection with selected classes
