**"Literacy Changes Our World"**

**Literacy Week on Morning Announcements:** Literacy Quote of the Day, contest updates, today/tomorrow's thematic dressing, homeroom activity of the day.

### **Ongoing**

- **NewsELA points challenge:** All points earned by students in homeroom will be tallied from Friday January 20 to Thursday January 26, 2017, and the homeroom with the most points by Thursday wins a prize on Friday.
- **Caught Reading Raffle:** Students randomly caught outside of class reading non-textbooks get a raffle ticket to be entered in a drawing for an Amazon book card, and candid pictures of students and staff caught in the act of reading scroll on cafeteria TV. **AND Shelfie Scroll:** Send your "shelfie" to Mrs. Onorato's email: you with your favorite/current book in the library. Pictures will scroll on school TV.
- **Poetry Wall:** Students submit their original poetry to be displayed as a poetry quilt bulletin board in cafe; begin a literary magazine with ELA, art, and computer depts, continued through April 2017. ELA teachers collect poems January 9-19.
- **Homeroom DEAR:** Students will read silently during Power Hour homerooms each day this week: 25 minutes @ 5 days--for *Florida's Just Take 20* program <http://www.fldoe.org/academics/standards/just-read-fl/just-take-20/educators/> Number of minutes are tallied as part of homeroom competition.
- **Thematic Dressing Week:** contest in homeroom as outlined below; pictures scroll during cafeteria during lunches
- **Guess the Number of Books in the Library contest.** Students put a number in a jar with a donation to library fund to buy new books for the library.
- **Book Drive:** Students will collect books for donations to a charity group promoting literacy. Book donations will be collected in the library but tallied and recorded by students' homerooms as part of the homeroom contest.
- **Amanda Nelson 1/26 and Clint Raulerson 1/24** will present words of wisdom or their experiences as writers for selected classes or during Power Hour lunch.

<b>Thursday</b>	<b>Hats off to Reading Day:</b> Wear a hat, preferably with a saying or a symbol that has meaning, showing appreciation for literacy.	Record number of students wearing a business attire (dress shirts/ties; dresses or dress pants and blouse/ jackets), the minutes spent reading, and NewsELA points earned today.
<b>Friday</b>	<b>Cozy PJ Reading Day:</b> Students will wear appropriate pajamas if they bring in a gently used book to read in homeroom or donate to the library book collection of gently used or new books.	Record the number of students in pajamas WITH a book to read, donate, or share; and the number of minutes reading. NewsELA winners reward day today..

**Tentative Literacy Week Plan 2017**  
**January 23-27, 2017**

The state theme is "Literacy Changes Our World." We have decided to expand on this to a theme of "Literacy Makes our World a Kinder Place." Many of our activities will revolve around the theme of kindness.

Monday- Academic Games tournaments (Scrabble, Scattergoreis, etc.) during Power Hour/Advisory time

Tuesday- Student Book Club meeting to discuss book (TBA) that has a kindness focus during Power Hour

Tuesday - After school- Faculty book group will meet to discuss a book selection read by interested faculty members

Wednesday- Poetry Out Loud competition during Power Hour/fifth period

Thursday – First Grade visits from all three elementary schools to tour and experience literacy activities revolving around a kindness theme. All ELA classes will be involved prior to this day in writing stories of kindness using sight words to accompany pictures submitted by first graders. These pictures and stories will be displayed in the media center and during their visit first graders will be read their story.

Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday – During Power Hour certain classrooms will air documentaries or movies that demonstrate acts of kindness and paying it forward.
