Thursday

 Book-tasting – Students will be invited to the media center during 1st period. The tables will be set up and decorated as if for a brunch, but the entrée will be books. The students will review the book for a set period of time, then switch tables when signaled until all books have been sampled. May occur on multiple days if the response is large.

Friday

 Poster – The students will create a poster depicting their favorite super hero reading a book. These will be displayed around the school.
