Students can then choose to respond through artistic expression and/or digital expression. Each school celebrates the student work at a site SLAM Showcase and submits outstanding entries from each Division/Category for the District event in spring of each year.

Monroe's SLAM will be held on January 25, 2018. Students have been coming in to the Media Center before school, during lunch and after school on Thursdays to work on their projects. Winners of the 2D Art and Video divisions will receive certificates and attend the District Showcase in March.
