Monday, January 28	<p><u>Elementary:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * School Wide Read Out (the entire school reads outside on towels for 20 minutes) * Musical Munchie Monday (students listen to music & enjoy a snack while reading) * Magazine Monday (read magazines together) * Star Reading Galaxy Displays (one star for every book read) * Whole School Reading Time * Millions Monday (classes will read MILLIONS of words on Monday) * Community Members & Family Members will be reading in classrooms
Tuesday, January 29	<p><u>Elementary:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Video Student Book Reviews of SSYRA (students begin creating videos of their reviews to be aired on the school news program) * Tumblebooks Tuesday (students are challenged to read as many Tumblebooks as possible with the results announced on the school news program) * Tall Tale Tuesday (read tall tales) * STEM focuses on written data collection; Read a Shirt Day; Literacy Night at the Family Center (come read and take AR tests and eat pizza) * Buddy Read * Totally Tuesday (school leader reads favorite book on school news—all students totally drop everything and read) * School-wide sidewalk reading (the whole school settles on the sidewalks with towels & blankets for reading time)
Wednesday, January 30	<p><u>Elementary:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Silly Socks Day (Fox in Socks read aloud on school news program) * Wordy Wednesday (wear clothes with words on them) * Wacky Jokes Wednesday (read and share wacky jokes) * Science journals and other non-fiction text are promoted by the STEM teacher and media specialist on school news program * Word Wednesday: vocabulary games, word-based activities * Wacky Wednesday: AP will share her favorite wacky character and students will go WACKY by reading books that are not in their preferred genre * Classrooms will make circle maps with book recommendations & design a book cover



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<p>Thursday, January 31</p>	<p><u>Elementary:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Continued work on video book reviews of SSYRA * Thinking Map Thursday (students make a Thinking Map about a book they have read) * Theater Thursday (Reader’s Theater) * Buddy Reading Day * Literacy Night—a family event with a variety of literacy activities, food, make & takes * Tailon Thursday—the principal will read a poem on the school news students create a Thinking Map of their own favorite book or character * Students will gather in the hallways and swap teachers and read their favorite stories
<p>Friday, February 1</p>	<p><u>Elementary:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Flashlight Friday (students bring in flashlights to read in the dark, glow in the dark bookmarks given to each students & Glow Run Event on the campus for students and families) * Flashlight Friday (read favorite book in the dark only by the light of a finger flashlight) * Fairytale Friday (fairytale are the genre to read) * Wear GREEN to celebrate reading, galaxy walks happen to see the number of books read) * Reading Zone Celebration (students are recognized for their reading achievements and get to silly string administration) * Funny Flashlight Friday (check out poetry books and try rapping various poems with flashlights) * Buddy Reading
<p>Week Long Activities</p>	<p><u>Elementary:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Book reviews (students will draw or write recommendations in a common area in the school) * Facebook Read Alouds—Staff will record a bedtime read aloud for families each night * Students will draw a picture in art that represents how reading has been a window to the world for them—(3-5)to be displayed in the cafeteria (K-2) grade level book in the media center * 5 Million Word Challenge! Tracking the number of words read for the week * Focusing on non-fiction texts—whether you are viewing through the lens of a microscope, telescope, glasses or the lens of your personal perspective—the focus is on literacy to communicate scientific thought. <p><u>Secondary:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Kids found on campus with a book will receive tickets * Free Writes—5 minutes each, school wide where they reflect on something they’ve read * Young Adult literature quotes from cool authors to be read during morning announcements * School news program interviews kids, teachers and support staff about what they are reading * Student generated book trailers on school news * Teen Choice Awards—with the winners announced on Friday * Book Tastings * Bingo for Books—during lunch * Food Drive for Fines 1 food item = dismiss 1 late fine
