Spreading Literacy, One View at a Time January 28 - February 1, 2019

Monday, January 28	Kick Off Celebrate Literacy Week! "Spreading Literacy, One View at a Time"
	 Public announcement from Leaders on the joy of reading. School administrators read aloud a snippet of a favorite book during morning announcements, and Tweet pictures to MDCPS_ELA, #LeadersRead. Create a school-wide reading wall: ELA classes will select a Caldecott winner picture book. Discuss how aspects of the text's illustrations contribute to what is conveyed by the words. After reading and discussing connections, the class will create a poster card that depicts the book cover and includes title, author, illustrator, and a sentence about the book. Select a visible location to pin class cards. Title the board: "Spreading Literacy, One View at a Time" Caldecott List of Winners: Schools can Tweet their pictures to MDCPS_ELA, #ReadingWall

Tuesday, January 29	 Viewing – Speaking - Listening Using District resources such as <u>Tumblebooks</u>, <u>Discovery Education</u>, <u>NBC Learn</u>, <u>Teaching Books</u>, classes will participate in a chosen book/author/topic lesson by engaging students in a literacy experience that will allow for viewing, speaking, and listening. Choose an appropriate video (literary or informational) from district resources to view and provide purpose for viewing and listening. Play video. Participate in collaborative discussions such as main ideas and supporting details. Ask and answer questions about the video speaking appropriately to address task, audience, and situation. Wednesday, January 30	Every Picture Tells a Story
	 Students design a book mark about a book/character/author/illustrator they love. Students share book marks to tell how their design relates to the text. Schools can Tweet their pictures to MDCPS_ELA, #EveryPictureTellsAStory

	 Plan a school assembly to celebrate literacy. At the assembly, view class created book videos. Share favorite books and spread literacy one view at a time. Allow students to interact with video creators/actors to discuss and/or conduct Q&A session. Invite members of the community, parents, and local media. Create a School Photo Booth – take pictures of classes and Tweet to MDCPS_ELA #BOOKTube
Ongoing School-wide Contest/Event Ideas (School Sponsored)	 Invite guest readers. Participate in cross-grade level reading buddies. Name the Book: Guess the title and author of famous first lines read during the morning announcements. Organize a book swap event. The Amazing Reading Race – track class reading minutes using school generated log or and recognize the class with the most minutes read during the week.
Parental Involvement #EngagedFamiliesMDC PS	 Conduct a Parent Workshop: "Spreading Literacy" and provide literacy tips (e.g., reading strategies, task cards, summary starters, question prompts, recommended books). Schedule a Book Talk for parents/grandparents. Book in Hand: Students bring a new or slightly used book to school. The school will donate the books collected to a charitable institute such as a hospital or homeless shelter. Host a FUN Literacy Night (e.g., Reader's Theater, Reading Under the Stars, Cookies & Bedtime Stories, What's New in Graphic Novels, You Read to Me, I'll Read to You).
