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| <p align="center">Monday, January 27nd</p> | <p>Super Readers/Super Heroes: Our Superintendent will read to our students on video. She will select a passage to read to our elementary students and a different one for our secondary students. Students, faculty, and staff at selected schools will dress as superheroes.</p> <p>The high school will kick off a week of language games. The middle school will start their bookmark design contest and Love-a-Book program for students to write why they love a book on a paper heart to be used as a recommendation for others to read the book.</p> |
| <p align="center">Tuesday, January 28rd</p> | <p>Book Character Day: Students, faculty, and staff will dress as book characters and share what they read with those around them.</p> |
| <p align="center">Wednesday, January 29th</p> | <p>Let's Hunt for a Good Book: Students, faculty, and staff will wear camouflage to school. Teachers will choose to read aloud from a book they found or have students hunt for a book they would like to read.</p> <p>Westside Elementary will host Project REACH (Reading Enriches All Children) by having community members read to children in each classroom and describe the role of reading in their work. Other elementary schools will also host guest readers or have teachers read to another class to give students increase motivation for reading and awareness of its role in the lives of adults.</p> |
| <p align="center">Thursday, January 30th</p> | <p>Tacky Tourist Day: We will dress as tourists and explore books available in our school library and classrooms. Teachers can choose to share a book about another country to build background knowledge.</p> |
| <p align="center">Friday, January 31st</p> | <p>Read My Shirt Day: Students, faculty, and staff will wear shirts with words (vocabulary, quotes, or literacy/education related messages) on them and encourage others to read their shirts. The high school will have only faculty and staff dress up for this day, but the students will be encouraged to read their shirts.</p> |
