Celebrate Literacy Week, Florida! January 27-31, 2020 District Nassau: Callahan Elementary School	
Monday, January 27nd	Teachers will read a book about Rainforests or a country/region that has a rainforest or jungle- Students will each have their own passport book, get a “stamp” for that location and write 2 things they learned about Rainforests.
Tuesday, January 28rd	Teachers will read a book about a beach or a state/country known for their beaches. Students will receive a stamp in their passport and write 2 things they learned about beaches.
Wednesday, January 29th	Teachers will read a book about the desert or a state/country known for their deserts. Students will get a stamp for that location and write 2 things they learned about the desert.
Thursday, January 30th	Teachers will read a book about the arctic or tundra, or a state or country known for having arctic conditions or tundra’s. Students will receive a stamp for this location and write 2 things they learned.
Friday, January 31st	Students will dress as tacky tourists, vote on the place they read about that they liked the best as a class, and take a picture in front of a “travel” photo booth. Teachers will sign their class up for a time to go a visit a guest reader (someone from administration) and hear about another place. They will receive a stamp for this place.

Monday, January 27nd	“Passport to Your Reading Adventure” – Students will receive a “passport” listing different reading activities for them to complete throughout the week.
