- 2. The effective leader cultivates a central educational mission that is democratic, creative, and focused on maximizing learning for students and staff in all areas: academic, personal, social, and emotional.
- 3. The effective leader establishes a culture of expectations of high levels of achievement for all students and staff, to raise the achievement levels for all students while striving to eliminate gaps in the achievement among students from diverse cultural, economic and social backgrounds.gap.
- 4. The effective leader manages the school as a system, applying quality management principles and practices that support continuous improvement of the essential elements of a learning organization.

Or incorporate the systems language throughout rather than adding a 4th guiding principle.
