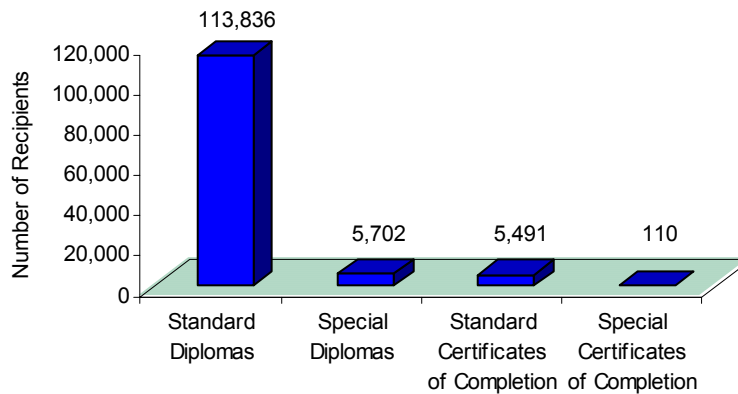

## Florida Public High School Graduates 2001-02 School Year

High school graduates in Florida public schools were awarded 119,538 standard and special diplomas during school year 2001-02. Of this total, 113,836 received standard diplomas and 5,702 received special diplomas. In addition, districts awarded standard certificates of completion to 5,491 students, and 110 students received special certificates of completion.

# Education Information and Accountability Services

Of the 119,538 diploma graduates, 74,165 (62.04 percent) were reported to have plans to continue their education in a postsecondary institution during the 2002-03 school year. Figure 2 details the postsecondary plans of the 2002 diploma graduates by the type of postsecondary institution they plan to attend and also indicates the number of students who did not indicate any postsecondary education plans.

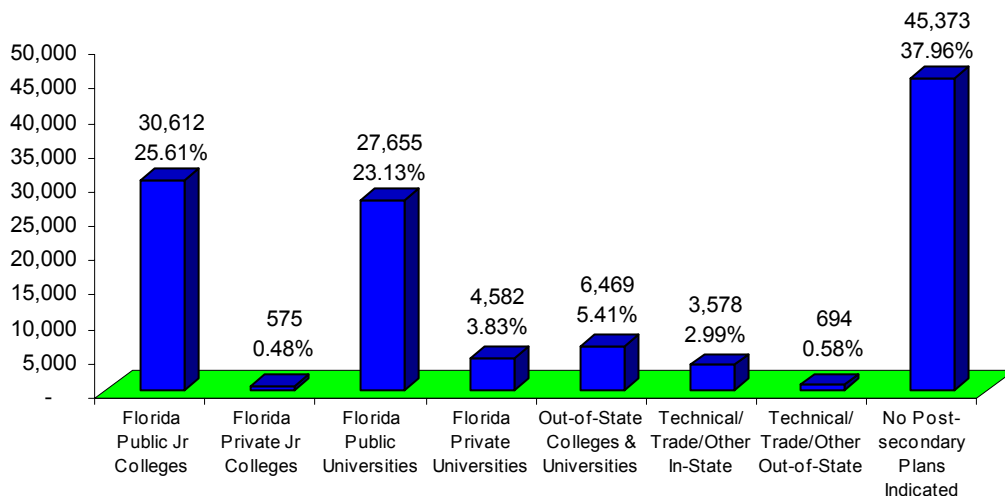
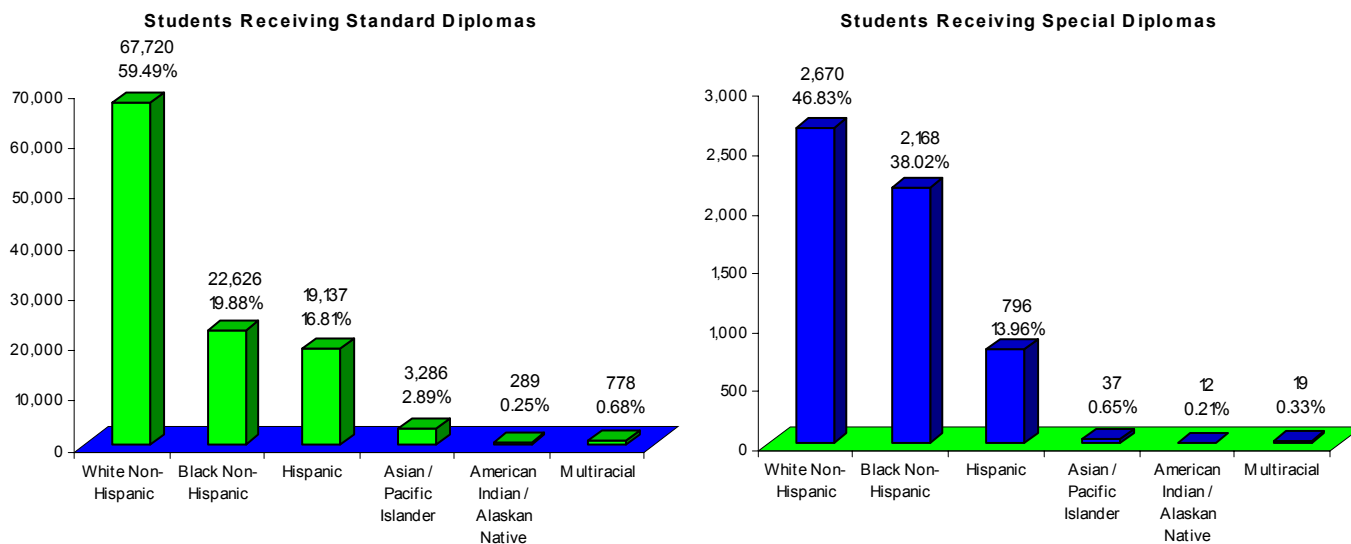
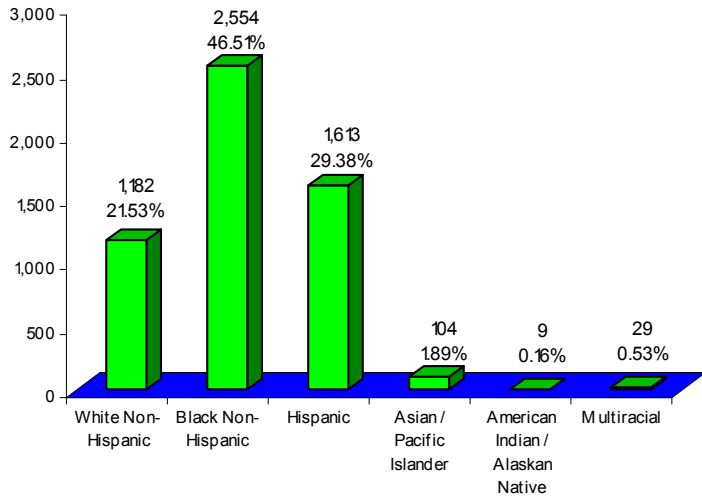


Figure 3 displays the number of graduates by diploma and certificate types and by racial/ethnic category.

**Students Receiving Special Certificates of Completion**

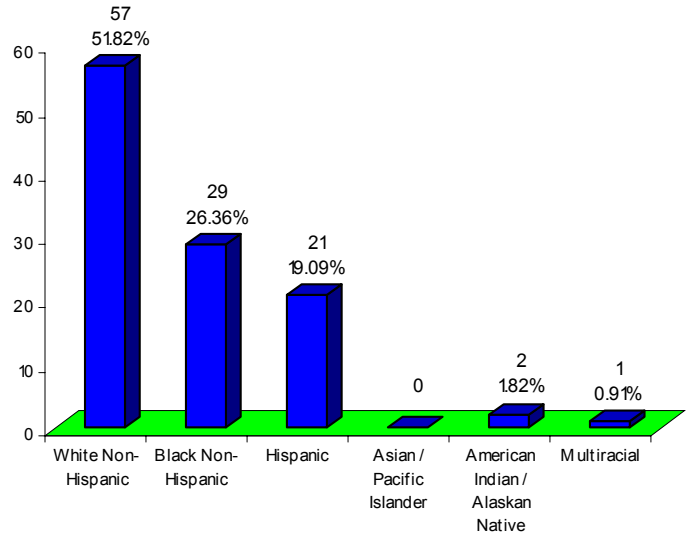

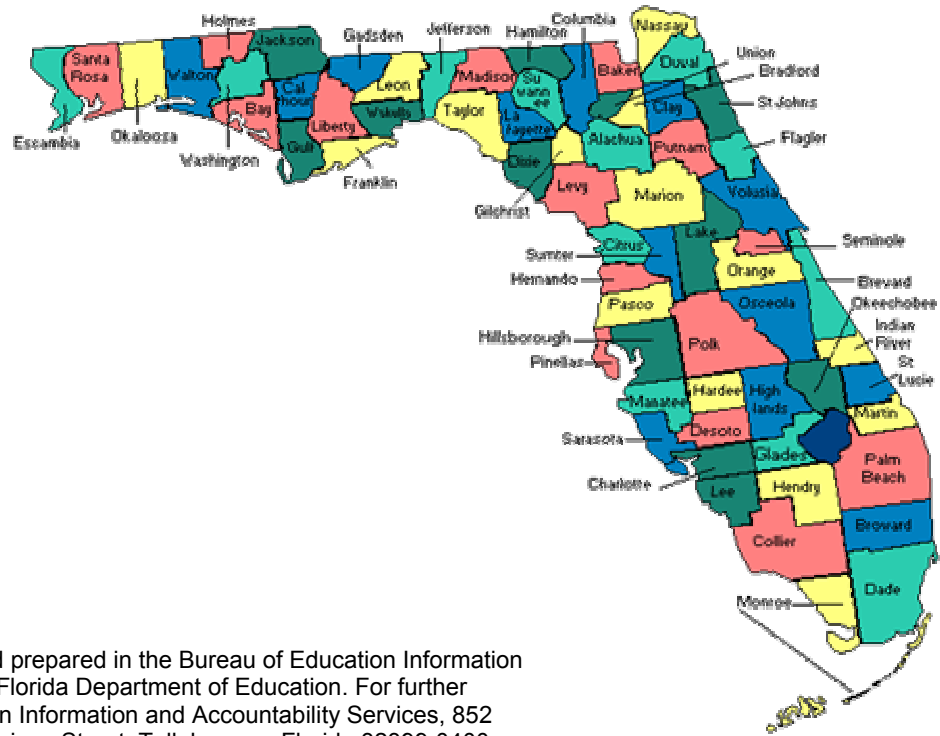
