8. Discuss the importance of industry certifications as they relate to high-quality post-secondary career and technical programs.



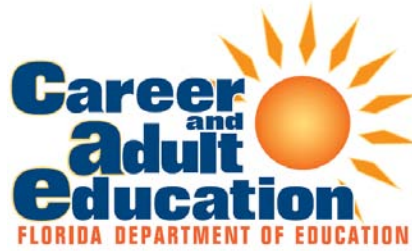
