Funding Authority

- Reauthorized under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA), as amended by the Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015 (ESSA) (20 U.S.C. 7221-7221j)
- Funds to be utilized for planning, program design, and initial implementation of new high-quality charter schools
- Maximum of 24 months in Implementation. All projects will begin in the Implementation Phase in 2020-21 school year

 - o Proposal Submitted Online
- Stage II- Invitation Only
 - Proposals submitted in Hard Copy Format (budget & superintendent signature required)

Stage I- Eligible Applicants

Applicants must meet the following conditions:

- Submitted a charter school application to a local school district using the Department's model charter school application (Form IEPC-M1, effective February 2016) as adopted in State Board of Education Rule 6A-6.0786; and:
 - Charter application has been approved by the district;
 - o Charter application is pending; or
 - o Charter application is denied and pending an appeal.
- Eligible applicants that meet the definition of a new operator must have successfully gone through a previous CSP grant competition review but had to rescind its award because it could not open a charter school by a time specific in that previous RFP.
- Further, eligible applicants <u>must open no later than August 2020</u>, or have opened a school in the 2017-18 or 2018-19 school years and have not previously received a CSP grant.





 - when possible, create a PDF instead of scanning a printed document
- Status button will change from PREREQUISITES NOT MET to INCOMPLETE to COMPLETE once applicant has met all prerequisites and is ready to submit application

The Department will utilize separate and distinct review processes for **established operators** (operators who have opened at least five charter schools in Florida) and **new operators** (operators who have opened less than five charter schools in Florida).

Stage I Review- New Operators

Completeness Review - (continued)

- DOE will be looking for:
 - Attestation
 - Spot checks with district sponsors to ensure the application submitted to the CSP competition is the same as that submitted to the district

Stage I Review- Established Operators

- Evaluation and scoring is based primarily upon past performance of network
 - Value Added Score
 - School Grades
 - High Need
 - Percentage of schools that are Title I
 - Percentage of students with disabilities
 - Stability
 - School Closures
 - Financial Performance

Established Operators Defined

Established Operators

- An applicant that has opened five or more public charter schools in Florida.
 This includes all charter school opened, including those that subsequently closed.
- If the applicant will work with a management company/education services provider that has operated five or more charter schools in Florida the applicant is considered an Established Operator.
- If the applicant has an established governing board (operated at least five schools) and an established management company/education service provider, the score will be based upon the schools operated by the governing board. If the applicant's governing board has not operated at least five charter schools in Florida, but will contract with a management company/education service provider that has, the score will be based upon the schools managed by the management company/education service provider. Each calculation will be rounded to one decimal place.

Stage I Review- Preference Points (New & Established)

- Service Area
 - Schools that will operate in districts that received a grade of "C" or lower for last two years
- Student Recruitment and Enrollment
 - Applicants who score a rating of "Exceeds Expectations on relevant section of the model charter application
- District Partnerships
 - Applicants that will open a charter school as part of district-charter compact partnership
