5. Implementation of HB 1157, Postsecondary Education for Veterans	Dr. Karinda Barrett provided an update on House Bill 1157 implementation. Section 1004.096, F.S., was amended to clarify that both active duty and veterans are able to earn academic college credit for college-level training and education acquired in the military. Section 1009.26, F.S., was modified to allow for Purple Heart recipients to be considered eligible for the tuition waiver. State Board of Education Rule 6A-14.0305, F.A.C., was also revised to include out-of-state fee waivers for active duty members of the U.S. Armed Forces.
6. Update on 2+2 Agreements	Dr. Jan Ignash updated the members on the work of the Board of Governors' Select Committee on 2+2 Articulation, a committee created at the request of the BOG Chair. The first meeting of the committee was held in early 2016, which covered an overview of state-level articulation policies, a review of SUS data on AA degree transfers and development of a committee work-plan. At its latest meeting, the Committee identified strategies for improving 2+2 articulation in Florida through advising, expansion of institutional agreements, and identification of best practices and research. Members asked that the focus of the Committee's work include a look at AS to Bachelor Degree graduates, a system-wide analysis of the advising toolkit, and a review of ladder agreements in place for AS degrees.
7. Fee Waivers for Homeless Students Attending Postsecondary Institutions	Dr. Brian Dassler presented on fee waivers and how the waivers relate to homeless students. The presentation centered around the definitions associated with homeless youth, the work of the Bureau of Federal Educational Programs, and highlighted the need for additional data. Currently, exemptions are authorized through state statute and BOG Regulation for homeless students. The BOG has determined that based on the definition of tuition, which is the basic fee charged for instruction, that tuition could be waived for homeless students but not the associated out-of-state fee. Other fees may be waived based on documentation provided by the student. Placement of a student in student housing or a residence hall would not alter the homeless status of the student.
8. SBE Strategic Plan Update	Dr. Madeline Pumariega provided an overview of the Department's Strategic Plan as it relates to Goal 2: Seamless Articulation and Maximum Access. The Division of Florida Colleges (DFC) is leading the charge to build upon the successes of Florida's articulation policies by 2020 through an increase in: • the postsecondary continuation rate (5%) • the associate degree articulation rate (5%) • access to high-quality K-12 educational options.

9. Information on Articulation for Careers in Early Childhood Education	Dr. Denise Bishop, Outreach Coordinator for The Children's Forum, introduced Debra Metcalf, who presented the Florida Community College Early Childhood Educators Network (FCCECEN) position statement on the articulation of AS Degrees in Early Childhood Education to BS Degrees in Early Childhood Education (or related degrees). The FCCECEN has concerns that students are experiencing the addition of varying requirements at the postsecondary level for coursework that should have been obtained in their AS degree, which creates an undue academic and financial burden for the student. Recommendations include the creation of a statewide AS/BS articulation agreement, which could stipulate that a degree holder should be granted admission at the postsecondary level and that the degree be fully transferrable.

Item #4: Update to the ACC Credit-by-Exam List Narrative

ACC Action: Approval

During the 2016 Legislative session section 1007.27(2), Florida Statutes, was revised to include DSST (DANTES) and Defense Language Proficiency Test (DLTP) exams as mandated portions of the ACC Credit-by-Exam. The DSST was previously included through authorization by State Board of Education Rule 6A-10.024. DLPT is a new addition to this requirement.

Section 1007.27(2), Florida Statutes, requires the Articulation Coordinating Committee (ACC) to establish passing scores and course and credit equivalents for Advanced Placement (AP), Advanced International Certificate of Education Program (AICE), International Baccalaureate (IB), and College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) exams. The DSST (DANTES) and Excelsior College exam equivalents on the list are not part of that requirement, but are authorized by State Board of Education Rule 6A-10.024.

Public community colleges and universities in Florida are required to award the minimum recommended credit for AP, AICE, IB and CLEP exams as designated.

Section 1007.27(2), Florida Statutes, requires the Articulation Coordinating Committee (ACC) to establish passing scores and course and credit equivalents for Advanced Placement (AP), Advanced International Certificate of Education Program (AICE), International Baccalaureate (IB), DSST (DANTES), Defense Language Proficiency Test (DLPT), and College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) exams. The UEXCEL and Excelsior College exam equivalents on the list are not part of that requirement, but are authorized by State Board of Education Rule 6A-10.024.
