INTRODUCTION

The 5-Year District Facilities Work Program is a very important document. If the "Remaining Funds" balance is negative, then the plan is neither balanced nor feasible.

If the "Remaining Funds" balance is greater than zero, the plan may be feasible, but it is not balanced.
