INTRODUCTION

The 5-Year District Facilities Work Program is a very important document. The Department of Education, Legislature, Governor's Office, Division of Community Planning (growth management), local governments, and others use the work program information for various needs including funding, planning, and as the authoritative source for school facilities related information.

The district's facilities work program must be a complete, balanced capital outlay plan that is financially feasible. The first year of the work program is the districts capital outlay budget. To determine if the work program is balanced and financially feasible, the "Net Available Revenue" minus the "Funded Projects Costs" should sum to zero for "Remaining Funds".

If the "Remaining Funds" balance is zero, then the plan is both balanced and financially feasible.

If the "Remaining Funds" balance is negative, then the plan is neither balanced nor feasible.

If the "Remaining Funds" balance is greater than zero, the plan may be feasible, but it is not balanced.

Planning

The District has twelve charter schools with a current enrollment of 5,919. The School Board approved the following school capacity levels: Elementary Schools 110% by School Service Area (SSA) of FISH capacity; Middle Schools 105% by SSA of FISH capacity; and High Schools 100% district-wide of FISH capacity. Re-districting is contemplated to level capacity among district schools. The District also offers magnet schools, virtual schools and an extensive choice program to better utilize facilities within the District.

School Closure Planning

In 2014/2015 Rowlett Elementary School became a conversion Charter School, William Monroe Rowlett Academy for Arts & Communication, Inc.

In 2013/2014, the District disposed of the Checkers Owens property consisting of 1.36 acres located at 115 Manatee Avenue West. Revenue from the sale was \$1,400,000. The District also disposed of a 10 acre outparcel at Braden River High School and a 3.5 acre outparcel at Bayshore High School. Revenue from this sale was \$2,950,000.

In 2014/2015, the District anticipates selling the Parent Information Center (PIC) located at 234 Manatee Avenue East. Revenue from that sale is expected to be \$390,000.

It is the District's intent to review all properties for potential surplus and sale to enhance the general and capital funds.
