WHEREAS, public charter school students, teachers, and parents work together to improve student achievement – raising the standard for all public school students statewide; and

WHEREAS, the State of Florida joins the Florida Consortium of Public Charter Schools and the Florida Charter School Alliance in celebrating the contributions of charter schools to public education;
