FFEA Education Research Competition

OVERVIEW:

This is a chapter competition. Chapters will develop a PowerPoint presentation to provide information which highlights the effects of teacher and student attendance on impacting student learning gains.

TOPIC:

• What are the effects of teacher and student attendance on impacting student learning gains?

ELIGIBILITY:

- Each chapter may submit only one presentation.
- Presentations are to be created by student members.

GUIDELINES:

- Collaborate as a chapter to research the effects of teacher and student attendance on impacting student learning gains.
- Use the information collected in the research to create a persuasive PowerPoint presentation.
- The PowerPoint presentation should deliver the chapter's research findings.
- Length: 5-25 slides; points will be deducted for PowerPoint presentations that do not meet the length requirement.
- Include a title slide with the title of your project and school name.
- Include a credits slide with the student creators, sponsoring teacher(s), and the source of any non-original, multimedia elements (images and sounds).
- Include cited references and a work cited slide (MLA, APA, or Chicago style are acceptable).
- Only one submission per chapter is permitted.

SCORING:

- The presentation will be scored using the attached rubric. The maximum total number of points possible is 16.
- The top three winners will be announced during the closing session on Sunday, February 2, 2025.

*Please note: Both high school and postsecondary entries will be scored within the same category based on the attached rubrics.
