Dear Chancellors,

Senate Bill 240 was signed into law by Governor Ron DeSantis and took effect on July 1, 2023. The legislation requires the Florida Credentials Review Committee to establish a process for removing credentials from the <u>Master Credentials</u> <u>List</u> that no longer meet the <u>Framework of Quality</u>. Credentials must be listed for at least one year after identification before removal. The attached memo provides notice that credentials granted provisional status on the 2023-2024 Master Credentials List will remain on the list as approved through the 2024-2025 school year.

Additional information including deadlines for applications for credentials to be considered for the Master Credentials List and/or eligible for Career and Professional Education (CAPE) secondary or post-secondary funding for the 2024-2025 year is included in the attached memo. The memo has been shared with Florida's local workforce development boards. Please share it with your distribution lists as appropriate.
