The FIN facilitator provides services in one of seven geographical regions to districts and schools in the development and implementation of innovative, research-based instructional methodologies and support models for the education of students with disabilities in general education environments. The FIN facilitator guides and assists schools and districts in analyzing State Performance Plan Indicator 5 educational environment data, student performance data and best practice indicators in identifying needs to develop short-and long-term improvement efforts to increase educational outcomes for students with disabilities. 2023-2024 ESE Parent Survey

Each year, the FDOE surveys parents of students with an individual educational plan to determine how well districts and schools are partnering with parents and promoting parent involvement in their student's education. All states must collect these data for reporting on their State Performance Plan, as required under the IDEA. Additionally, survey results will be used to help schools and districts improve services and outcomes for students with disabilities. School Best Practices for Inclusive Education (SBPIE) Assessments

In June and July 2024, FIN is providing each district with one through 12 premade kits for use in completing SBPIE assessments in 2024-25 in accordance with section 1003.57, Florida Statutes, (F.S.). The most recent SBPIE assessments and associated reports may be accessed by ESE directors using the BEESS <u>General Supervision Website</u>. The SBPIE assessment kits contain materials needed for school teams to complete the SBPIE assessment, including group norms, assessment protocols, process cards, response cards, and a glossary. Kits may be replenished as needed using a QR code to access files for printing. Directors of ESE should complete the <u>Kits for SBPIE Assessments 2024-25 form</u> to provide the necessary information regarding the provision of the SBPIE Assessment kits to each district. Restraint Data for April 2024 are Now Available

April 2024 data for restraint incidents submitted to the Involuntary Examination, Restraint, and Seclusion (known as IERS) web application is now available. The data have been posted to the <u>Program Accountability, Assessment & Data Systems web page</u> and can be located by scrolling down to the section titled "SWD Restraint Data – SY 2023-24," and selecting the appropriate month. Pursuant to section 1003.573(8), Florida Statutes, "The FDOE shall maintain aggregate

data of incidents of restraint and disaggregate the data for analysis by county, school, student exceptionality, and other variables, including the type and method of restraint used. This information shall be updated monthly, deidentified, and made available to the public through the FDOE's website."

Schedule Time to Explain Evaluative Decisions

A parent may not understand why the district evaluated a child in certain areas but not others. When your team declines to assess a student in a particular area, set aside time to explain why the team concluded that subject was not an area of concern.
